The Book of Kells, *Chi Rho monogram page*, ca. 800. One of the most sublime examples of medieval painting ever seen, this is the most important page in the late 8th-century Book of Kells, arguably the finest of all illuminated manuscripts of the Middle Ages and famous for the intricate swirling patterns of its Celtic art. The book was created about 800 by Irish monks in the monastery of Iona, off the western coast of Scotland. The miniature painting which fills the Monogram page (which measures about 9.8 inches wide by 13 inches tall) is almost entirely devoted to the two Greek letters Chi and Rho (the first two letters of the Greek word for Christ) which together form Christ's monogram. Dominated by complex Celtic designs—featuring Celtic interlace, knots, and spirals, key patterns and zoomorphic images—whose intricacy is astounding, the page also features several well-hidden figurative images. These include three angels, as well as two mice eating a communion wafer.

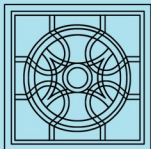

Classes will be offered for three different age groups:

- Children ages 3 to 2nd grade will engage in faith formation through Godly Play curriculum.

Want to ease or reduce stiffness and pain associated with arthritis while improving your health, balance, and sense of wellbeing? Tai Chi for Arthritis and Falls Prevention (TCA) is an evidence-based program recommended by the CDC and the Arthritis Foundation. TCA is based on Sun style tai chi, a style chosen because of its healing component, its unique Qigong* elements (*an exercise which improves relaxation and vital energy), and its ability to improve mobility, confidence, and balance. We will learn an excellent set of warm-ups that you’ll love doing daily, invigorating Qigong breathing exercises, and safe, flowing and soothing tai chi movements.

Elissa Berardi is certified as a Tai Chi instructor by the Oriental Fitness Institute of Philadelphia and has taught Tai Chi since 2010. She is also certified to teach Tai Chi for Arthritis and Falls Prevention and Tai Chi for Osteoporosis by the international Tai Chi for Health Institute

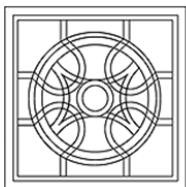
