

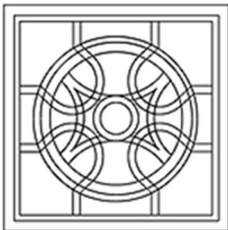

### NEW TESTAMENT LESSON

Joshua 4:1-7

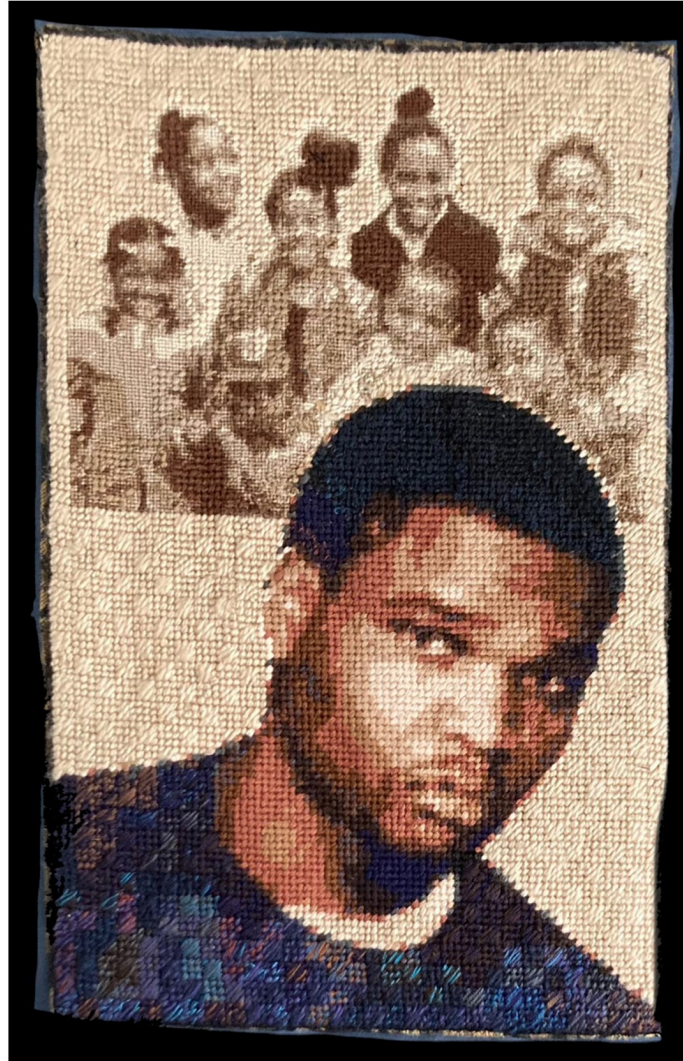

## PCCH PNC UPDATE

November 14, 2023 Session Meeting  
November 19, 2023 Congregation Update

As part of our commitment to transparency and keeping the congregation informed, we are excited to share an update on the progress of the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). Over the past six weeks, the PNC, composed of nine dedicated members from our congregation—Matt Eastman, Bill Toffey, Beth Lutz, Tennyson Tippy, Margaret Spencer, Jeff Podraza, Beth Vaccaro, with Katie Connelly and David Thornburgh serving as our co-chairs—has been diligently at work.

With adherence to the confidentiality of the process, we will be providing regular updates to both the session and the congregation. Today, we want to give you a glimpse into the early stages of our journey.

The PNC is meeting weekly on Monday evenings. Our first step involved meeting with our Commission on Ministry (COM) representative, Ashley Rossi. She reviewed the process with the group and will be a resource throughout the search. Our first large task was to review the Mission Study, updated by session during the spring, and finalized in September. The study became the foundation for crafting our Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP), essentially a detailed job description for our future pastor. We also met with members of the personnel committee, which helped inform what was included. The MDP was brought to session in October, received feedback which was incorporated, approved by both the session and the Commission on Ministry, and posted widely.

Looking ahead, the PNC has established a robust candidate review process that will guide our evaluation of each applicant. Currently, we are actively engaging with various friends of PCCH to network and explore potential candidates. Our next steps involve reaching out to candidates and beginning to review applications in earnest.

Your prayers and support during this pivotal time are invaluable to us. We will continue to provide updates as we progress in this journey of discernment and selection.



However, when David takes his family back to Poland for one last performance, Avi starts asking questions and they discover that someone else had a hand in Saba's survival. An uplifting story about music, faith, family and resilience, proving love can grow and take hold in even the darkest of places. This film is directed by Sara Taksler (*Tickling Giants*), with Hillary Rodham Clinton and Chelsea Clinton, executive producers.

Avi Wisnia will be joining us to perform some of "Saba's Songs" on piano and to lead a Q & A session following the film. Avi is an award-winning singer, songwriter, storyteller, and educator based in Philadelphia. He performs in venues around the world including the Hammerstein Ballroom in New York and the Kennedy Center in D.C., with concert tours in Japan, Poland, and Brazil.
